Opportunities for everyone

Have you worked in aged care or disability support previously? Or recently completed your studies?

Depending on your qualifications, there are opportunities to start as a Personal Care Attendant, or Registered or Enrolled Nurse right away.

Have you previously cared for a loved one?


Whether it be an ageing parent, grandparent, or someone with a disability, this lived experience is also considered for Personal Care Attendant roles.

A Personal Care Attendant supports their clients with their daily living needs. These may include hygiene and grooming assistance, domestic duties, companionship through games and activities, and escorting to and from social outings and appointments.



You can progress to a Personal Care Attendant through completing your Certificate III in Individual Support or Certificate IV in Ageing Support while you work as a Home Care Attendant. This typically takes around 12 months, if studying full-time.

Don't have any experience?
